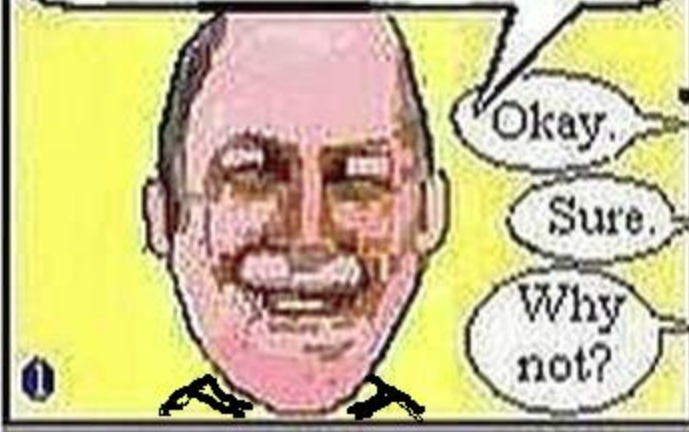


We want to welcome brother Peacemaker to our meeting. He has asked for permission to speak. Is it okay?

If we add things to worshiping God, are we showing love to God or to ourselves? Isn't it a "sin" to go beyond what is taught?



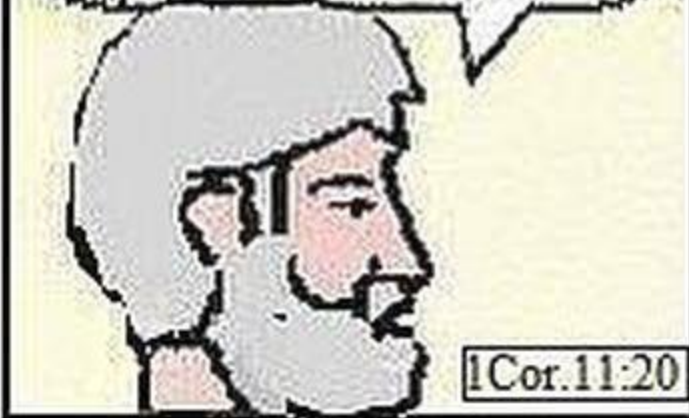
The apostles were given power to teach what was bound in Heaven for us to do. They taught us about communion worship.
