For examples, these are secular:
 1. Abraham bows to* Heth when burying Sarah.

2. Joseph's brothers come & bow down* before him.

Gen. 42:6

 David fled from Absalom and worships God on Olivet.

People went yearly to sacrifice and to worship. **1 Sam. 1:3**
 at the Temple



They were to set the firstfruits before the Lord and worship.

Deut. 26:10



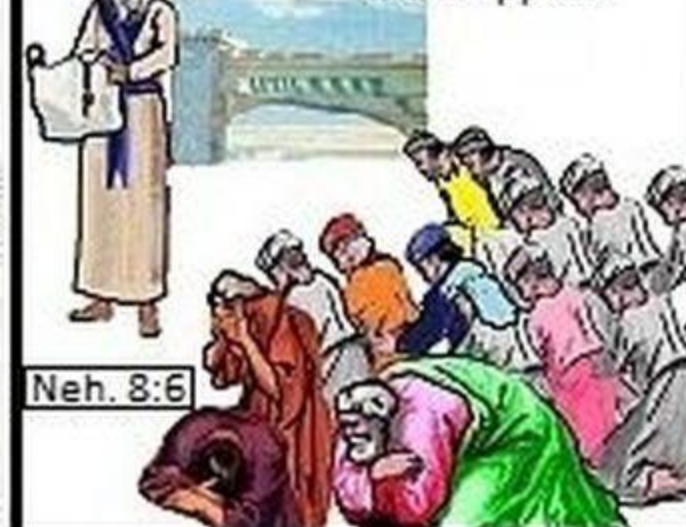
Levites sang and played. The people worshipped.

 at the Temple



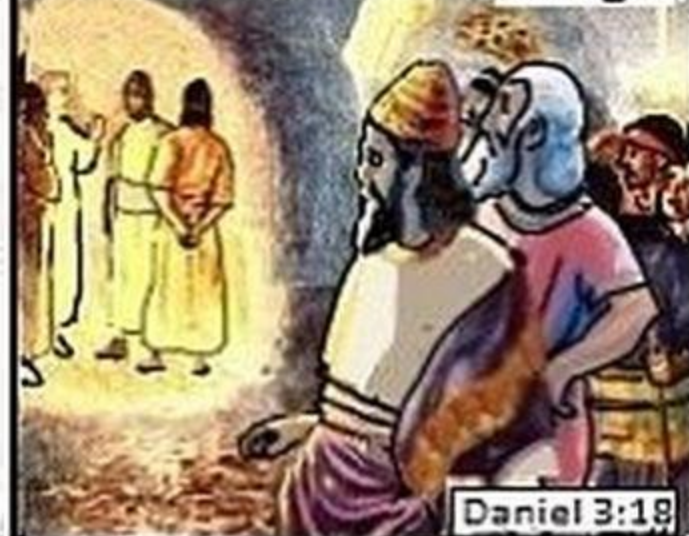
The Law was read 1/4 day and 1/4 they confessed and worshipped.

Daniel 3:18

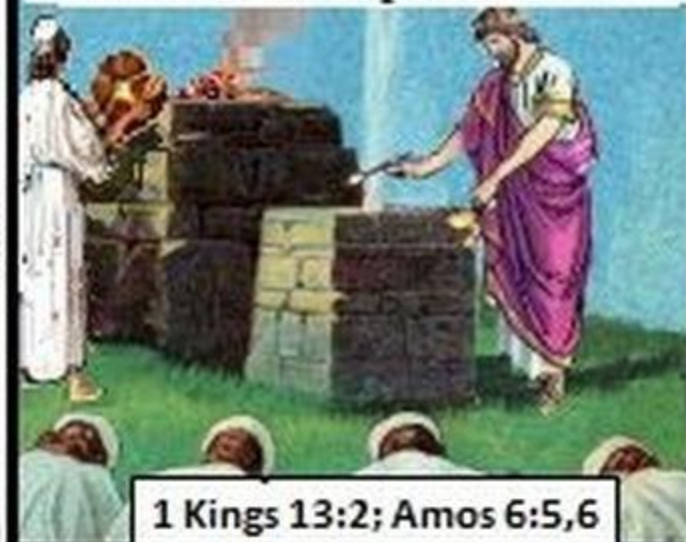
Mordecai could not do reverence to Haman.
